Nick's Inn 62 welcomes patrons with traditional, homemade food

Much like the longtime television sitcom *Cheers*, Nick's Inn 62 Restaurant and Tavern takes pride in welcoming regular patrons while knowing their names. For more than 20 years, owners Nick and Debbi Morocco have provided quality cuisine along with an inviting, friendly atmosphere at 1890 E. State St., Hermitage.

"We have tried to maintain a mom-and-pop establishment and keep our prices fair and affordable," says Nick Morocco. "We would rather have guests two or three times a week than only once a month."

Traditional recipes for house specialties like lasagna, several pastas, along with wedding soup, stuffed pork chops and stuffed chicken breast are overseen for the past decade by chef Jim Wansor, formerly of The Wave, which thrived for many years in downtown Sharon.

The extensive menu has spaghetti, rigatoni, cheese ravioli, homemade cavatelli, chicken or veal parmigiana, smothered chicken, grilled chicken, ham steak, and salads. Sandwich choices include hamburgers, pressed steak hoagie, Italian steak hoagie, meatball hoagie, hot sausage hoagie, or Italian hot dogs.

Haddock is popular on Friday with selection of Italian breaded, beer battered or broiled fish, coleslaw or salad, and a side. Beer and a fully-stocked bar complement the cuisine.

Nick and Debbi purchased the restaurant in September 2003 from the Ciambotti family, which established and operated it for 44 years.

Businesses of Nail Designs and DeJulia Styling are separate in the building.

Nick is retired after careers of 47 years as a high school and college basketball official and 23 years as a City of Sharon firefighter. Numerous friends and acquaintances drop by regularly to sample Nick's fare.

Hermitage Small Biz Group Formed

On January 23rd over 40 small business owners and representatives met at Valley Kitchen to form the Hermitage Small Biz group. Hermitage Small Biz is a collaborative and creative group focused on promoting small businesses in the city and the amenities the city has to offer. City officials attended the inaugural meeting and pledged to support the group in its endeavors.

Hermitage Small Biz was organized by Summer Wise, owner of So So Trendy Boutique, and was inspired by her collaboration with other small business owners for a successful Halloween Bootique Walk last year. The group has now expanded and

plans a Spring Hop Shop event on April 12-13, a Small Business Saturday event on November 30, and promotions for the return of the American Roller Sports National Speed Skating contest at Olympic Fun Center on June 10-14, among other collaborative opportunities.

The second meeting of Hermitage Small Biz is set for April 9th at 6:00 p.m. at Vey's Pub & Grille and advance reservations are required. Future meetings will be publicized through the Hermitage Small Biz Facebook group and on City of Hermitage Social Media. New Eateries Opening

Hermitage continues to attract a variety of restaurant and food and drink businesses to meet the tastes of our community. Last summer, One Hot Cookie opened its first Pennsylvania location in the Hermitage Square Plaza near Starbucks. One Hot Cookie offers a variety of cookies, cookie cakes, brownies and other sweet treats that are freshly baked and kept at 110 degrees in their warming cabinet, with a variety of toppings that can be added onsite. Bookings for birthday parties are available and a mobile Cookie Camper is available for rent.

In February, Jersey Mike's opened a location in the Hermitage Towne Plaza at 2427A E. State Street. Jersey Mike's offers fresh-sliced sub sandwiches, including veggie options, beef and chicken cheese steaks, drinks, cookies, brownies, and chips. Catering and personal lunch boxes are also available for order.

Recently, Ciani's reopened at its former location on Route 18 at 489 S. Hermitage Road. Ciani's menu includes homemade pasta and Italian specialty features, appetizers, homemade soups and salads, signature sandwiches and boneless wings. Carryout and catering are available and the restaurant offers BYOB service.

Starbucks is constructing a second location in the city at the former Denny's site at the intersection of E. State Street and Buhl Farm Drive. The new location will include an outdoor patio and drive-thru.

MP Coney Island is finishing renovations to the former Stone Church building at 600 S. Hermitage Road. In addition to its famous chili dogs, Coney Island offers burgers, sandwiches and fries, drinks, a snack menu and chili to go.

Finally, construction is slated this year for a McAlister's Deli location on Route 18 across from the Walmart plaza. McAlister's Deli offers fresh sandwiches, soups, and salads, and is famous for its giant spuds and delicious sweet tea.



UPMC Minutes Matter

The City of Hermitage and UPMC partnered to provide a Minutes Matter open forum training on February 26th, at LindenPointe's Workforce Training and Development Center. Around forty attendees engaged in hands-on education on handling initial moments of cardiac events, opioid overdoses, mental health crises, and uncontrolled bleeding emergencies. Participants practiced techniques like wound packing and tourniquet application. The interactive format allowed for participants to discuss each topic with UPMC educators. 2024 Major Infrastructure Improvement Projects

During 2024, the city will be undertaking over \$4 Million in capital infrastructure improvement projects funded by the 2024 Capital Budget, Community Development Block Grant, Hermitage Municipal Authority, American Rescue Plan Act, PennDOT funds and previous bond issue funds. In addition, some street paving and sanitary sewer improvements will be made in the Wheatland neighborhood, with locations to be determined. The projects are:

2024 Capital Paving Project: Project location is Jerry Lane, Fran Lane (Jerry Lane to Maria Lane) and Tiffany Lane (Jerry Lane to Maria Lane). Project is to mill pavement and apply new asphalt.

2024 Neighborhood Investment Program (NIP) Project: The block targeted for investment is bounded by North Buhl Farm Drive, Shenango Valley Freeway, Baker Avenue and East State Street. This year's works will include milling pavement and installing a storm sewer system on South Oakdale Avenue (Fern Street to State Street) and Trace Street (South Oakdale to Wick Avenue). The objective of the Neighborhood Investment Program is to systematically upgrade the City infrastructure, one area at a time in our older, established neighborhoods before deterioration begins by identifying the program areas, taking a

comprehensive assessment of existing conditions including input from property owners and residents, determining needs and developing a work plan, funding sources and a timeline. The anticipated program outcomes are to develop public/private partnerships where property owners and utilities work with the City on area improvements, such as upgrading and improving public facilities, and the residents continue to maintain or improve their properties maximizing property values and a high quality of life in our neighborhoods.

2024 CDBG Streets Improvement Project: Project is to install a storm sewer system on King Drive (Buhl Farm Drive to South Crescent Drive) and South Crescent Drive (King Drive to southern end). Also, South Crescent Drive (King Drive to southern end) will be milled and paved.

Kelly Road Improvement Project: The City has been awarded a transportation grant through the Mercer County Metropolitan Organization (MPO), Surface Transportation Urban (STU), in the amount of \$462,795, for a project to improve Kelly Road. The scope of work includes new pavement, stormwater upgrades and bicycle and pedestrian improvements. The project will be in cooperation with the Borough of Sharpsville's plans to improve High Street and Mercer Avenue.

Hermitage Road/Route 18 Median Beautification Project: This project will remove the larger concrete medians along both North and South Hermitage Road (Route 18) between the Shenango Valley Freeway and School Drive and replace the concrete with appropriate attractive landscaping. The project is a component of the Town Center Project and is planned to be completed in 2024.

South Neshannock Sanitary Sewer Extension Project: The project will extend municipal sewers south on South Neshannock Road from East State Road to Miller Road. It will also add sewers from South Neshannock Road west on Virginia Road to South Darby Road and on Miller Road from South Neshannock Road to South Darby Road. The project will add approximately 93 homes to the system and will make vacant land available for future development. The project is scheduled to begin construction in late 2024 and completed in 2025.

East State Street Pedestrian Improvement Project (PennDOT): The project will add sidewalks on State Route 3008 (East State Street) from Boyd Drive to State Route 18 (Hermitage Road) and approximately 300' North and South on State Route 3025 (Buhl Farm Drive). It is estimated the project will begin in July.

MINI GRANTS

BRHF is currently accepting applications for their Mini-Grant program. Local organizations may apply for grant money, in amounts up to \$5,000, to support collaborative programming focused on the health of our community. Eligibility guidelines, additional information, and the BRHF Grant Portal are available on our website.

AED+ PROGRAM

Buhl Regional Health Foundation, Staying Alive LLC, AHN Grove City, and the UPMC Jameson and Horizon Foundations continue their collaborative AED+ Program, a life-saving device and skills program for the community. The AED+ Program offers FREE AED's, staff training on the use of an AED, Hands-Only CPR training, and CPR Certification to all eligible non-profits, schools, and organizations in Mercer County. Interested parties may apply for the program on our website.

TEEN GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP

As part of the Youth Grief Support Program, BRHF, in collaboration with Baker Professional Counseling, offers a grief support group for adolescents and teens in 7th-12th grade. The support group meets on Saturday mornings at Grace Chapel, offering a safe and supportive space where adolescents and teens can connect with others who are going through similar experiences, share their thoughts and feelings, and learn coping strategies to help navigate their grief journey. The group is currently accepting registrations for the next session, which will run from August 24th – November 2nd. Interested parties must register via the intake form on our website.

CAMP COURAGE 2024

Registration has begun for the 3rd Annual Camp Courage program. Camp Courage, held at Buhl Park the week of July 29th – August 2nd, is a weeklong program for children (K-7) who have experienced grief and loss. The camp is free to families and provides both professional and peer support to grieving children, through a thoughtful curriculum focused on the

development of coping mechanisms, social skills and therapeutic activities. Registration is required to determine each camper's eligibility. Please register your camper on our website by June 30th.

YOUTH FEEDBACK CAMPAIGN

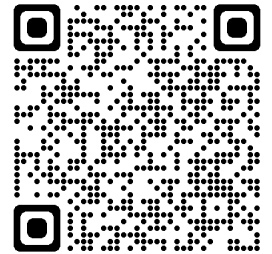

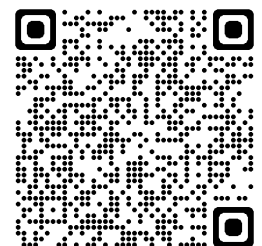


Pennsylvania Cybersecurity Center

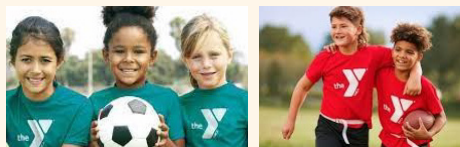

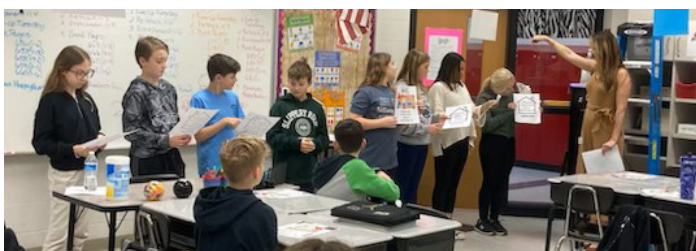

From the Hermitage Fire Department



In 2021, over 120,000 children between the ages of 0-12 years were injured in motor vehicle collisions, 746 of which were fatal, in the United States. One in three children who were fatally injured were not restrained. In February Deputy Fire Marshal Lawrence Clark completed a 32-hour course regarding instruction on

the proper selection, fit, and installation of child protective seats and restraint systems.

Through training, Clark became certified in car seat installation, enabling him to assist and teach guardians with installation. New and current parents alike can benefit from having a certified child passenger safety technician close by. Guardians can schedule a "car seat checkup" with Clark at which time the seat will be checked for proper fit in the vehicle, proper fit to the child, expiration, and any recalls.

Additionally, Hermitage Fire Department has become a car seat loan station. Seats can be loaned to guardians who need

them due to financial constraints or other reasons such as visiting children who only need to use a car seat for a brief time.

From the Desk of the Treasurer

Hello Spring, and welcome all new Hermitage residents, including our Wheatland Neighborhood! Our office is open to the public from 8:00a.m. to 4:00p.m., Monday through Friday except legal holidays, and you can reach us by phone or e-mail with any concerns you may have.

Just a reminder that tax bills are mailed twice a year. The County/City portion of your real estate bill goes out on **March 1st** of each year. The school bill along with the per capita bills are mailed on **August 1st**. If you do not receive your bills around the mailing dates, please notify us and keep in mind that it is the home-owners responsibility to know the due dates of taxes. It is important to keep your original bill for payment.

Once again, I'd like to explain the note on your bills stating that we need separate checks for each bill. Your County/City bill is one combined bill requiring only one check for the total amount due. Should you own more than one parcel, all County/

City bills may be made payable with one check if you so choose. School bills require a separate check as do your County/City, and Per Capita bills. Again, like bills may be combined but different bills cannot!

School bills, County/City and December courtesy notices all explain that we cannot accept personal checks for any payment after December 15th of the current year. We are hoping to have it added to our Per Capita bills this year also. After that date, you may still pay until December 31st by bank check, cash or money order. Personal checks received after Dec. 15th will be returned to the owner.

Whether you rent or own your home, you must register with the city for per capita tax billing. Per Capita tax is a head tax levied on anyone over the age of 18, living in the City of Hermitage. It remains at \$30.00 per person.

When making payments, it is not necessary to come in as you can mail your payment or leave it in the secure



drop box on the north side driveway. If you need a receipt, please include your **entire bill** along with a **self-addressed stamped envelope**, and we will return the stamped receipt to you.

Remember to register all rental properties with our office even if a family member is living there. This information is necessary to update our City census.
