Terms & Conditions

- Applications must include fee. Please make checks payable to City of Hermitage.
- Application fee is \$50 per 10'x10' display space. Electricity fee is an additional \$10.
- All Artists must exhibit their own, original work; all items must be handcrafted. Only the types of items indicated on the application form may be sold.
- No flea market or commercially produced items will be permitted.
- At least three photos (no slides) of work to be displayed must be submitted. Acceptance is up to the committee's discretion. If possible, at least one photo should represent the overall look of your display booth.
- Space will be assigned according to art category, variety of artwork sold, and on a first-come, first-serve basis. Application fee is non-refundable for cancellations received after May 30, 2016.
- Exhibitors must furnish their own displays and must furnish their own tables, table coverings, chairs, and any extension cords for electricity.
- All exhibitors must be set up for the two days of the event. Set up is 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. on Saturday, July 9, and 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. on Sunday, July 10.
- No early breakdowns permitted. Teardown permitted only after show hours.
- Instructions for unloading and parking area designation for exhibitors will be available at the registration booth.
- Proper insurance and protection of work and displays are the responsibility of the artist. Hermitage Arts Festival will not be responsible for damage to work or display due to weather or unrelated incidents. Security will be provided overnight.
- No more than two artists may share a regular 10'x10' space. Each artist must submit photos of work to be displayed and sold.

In this course you will learn basic knitting terminology and techniques – cast on, knit, purl, bind off, increase and decrease. At the end of the class you will have five dishcloths? They are small projects that give you enough time to get familiar with the various techniques, without being too overwhelming. And you can use them when you are done! (min. 3, max. 8)

- Knitting needles, size 8. These can be circular (24") or straight (wooden, bamboo, metal - not larger than 9-10").
- Sugar 'n Cream yarn (100% cotton). Solid color or variegated. You will need one ball for the first class.
- Small notebook and pen/pencil.
- Large-eyed blunt yarn needle.

Eagle Scout Projects

Eagle Scout is the highest achievement or rank attainable in the Boy Scouting program. The designation "Eagle Scout" has a long history since its founding over one hundred years ago. The requirements necessary to achieve this rank take several years to complete. Only a small percentage of Boy Scouts are granted this rank after a lengthy review process.

The following improvement projects to Whispering Pines Park were undertaken and completed by local Eagle Scouts.

Enhanced Wetland Project by Stephen Petrochko

The unmowed area in the northeast section of the park is a natural wetland which has been enhanced to improve its ecological



function and beauty. For his Eagle Scout project in 2014, Stephen Petrochko of Hermitage, along with the assistance of Boy Scouts, Troop 7 of Clark, PA installed the split rail fence to define the wetland boundary and birdhouses to provide shelter for Purple Martins and Bluebirds.

Stephen also planted Blackgum, Pin Oak, American Sycamore, Gray & Redosier Dogwood, Witchhazel, and

Buttonbush. A native flower and grass seed mix was also planted in the wetland. All plant material installed on this project are indigenous to Pennsylvania and will add to the biological diversity of the wetland.

Information Kiosk by Amon Blance

Eagle Scout Amon Blance of Hermitage, with volunteer help from family, friends and fellow Scouts, managed the design



and construction of an information kiosk which was installed at Whispering Pines Community Park, Route 62, Hermitage.

Amon worked in conjunction with Neil Hosick, Facilities Coordinator and Marcia Hirschmann, Director of Planning and Development for the City of Hermitage. The kiosk was installed adjacent to the parking lot in a common area

that includes tables and a historic bell. This project beautifies the park and provides a place to update the public on upcoming city activities as well as events at the Hermitage Historical Society.

Busy Year for Paving in Hermitage

The City of Hermitage and PENNDOT have multiple road paving projects planned this year. PENNDOT will pave East State Street from Keel Ridge Road through the intersection at Route 18 (Hermitage Road), the Freeway from East State Street to Route 18 and the entire length of Route 18 in the City. Also to be paved under PENNDOT contracts will be Mercer Avenue from Maple Drive to the Hermitage/Farrell city line and Forker Boulevard in the area of Buhl Park. All PENNDOT paving projects will include ADA pedestrian improvements at intersections and are state funded.

During 2016 the City will complete Phase III of Block 5 of the Neighborhood Investment Program. The streets of Woodlawn Drive, Fairfield Drive, Lillian Drive and Richmond Drive from Parkview Drive south to the Hermitage/Sharon city line will be milled and repaved with base repair as needed. Some limited stormwater facility improvements will be made as part of the project. This project is estimated to cost \$475,000. The City's capital paving program will mill, perform necessary base repair and repave Hasenflu Drive, Biscayne Drive, Monterey Lane and Theresa Avenue at a price of \$395,000 and, with the assistance of \$643,000 in state grant funds, mill and repave Clarksville Road at an estimated cost of \$955,000. In addition to the paving work, under its work exchange program with PENNDOT, named AGILITY, the City will have PENNDOT apply sealcoating to various City streets. The City will also perform crack sealing to preserve the integrity of recently paved streets where surface cracks have appeared.

Large Stormwater Infrastructure Projects in the Works

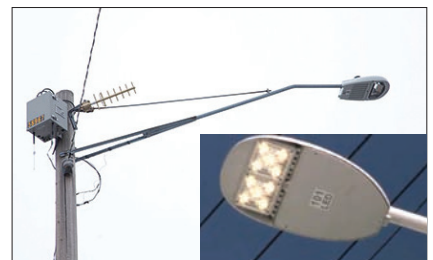
Also this year the City will replace a large drainage culvert under Robertson Road located between Lamor Road and Schwartz Lane. The metal culvert pipe is failing and impacting the structure of the roadway. It will be replaced with a concrete box culvert at a cost estimated to be \$225,000. Also during 2016 engineering work will be completed on a major stormwater improvement project in the industrial corridor at the southern end of the City near Broadway Avenue. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2017 with an estimated cost of over \$1,000,000. Engineering work will also be done this year on a stream rehabilitation project along Baker Run between Woodside Drive

and East State Street with construction planned also in 2017.

The City will work with our contractors to minimize the inconvenience associated with completion of these projects. We ask for everyone's cooperation while construction is underway. As always, please exercise extreme caution when traveling through a construction site. LED Technology For Street Lights

LED technology has come to street lights and Penn Power is currently in the process of converting all of the street lights in the City of Hermitage to LED. The fixtures are more square in appearance and emit a crisp white light. The conversion, being done in phases, should be complete by the end of the year. The result will be reduced maintenance and replacement costs for Penn Power and lower operational costs for the City. Hermitage has previously converted traffic signal lights and exterior building and parking lot lighting to LED technology.

City of Hermitage's Burning Ordinance



Spring is just around the corner and we are all thinking about cleaning up our yards and getting our gardens in shape for the season. I want to remind everyone about the City of Hermitage's Burning Ordinance. Burning hours are Monday thru Saturday, 6:00 a.m. until noon and materials that may be burned are limited to ordinary household Class

A debris; wood, paper, cloth, and related materials that do not create noxious odors and heavy smoke. Burning on Sundays and holidays is prohibited. Also, burning of any material that creates noxious odors or heavy smoke such as leaves, grass, shrubbery, household garbage, or creates a neighborhood

nuisance is prohibited. Remember, Tri- County Industries has a green lid yard waste cart for leaves, grass clippings, plants, sawdust, roots, etc. All burning must be accomplished in an approved burning container with at least 5 feet of clearance around the burning container and must be at least 15 feet from any structure or property line. Open flame or smoldering fires must be attended at all times and with the proper equipment to extinguish the fire in case it gets out of hand. No fires shall be started when wind or other factors are such to cause an unsafe or hazardous condition. Recreational fires for outdoor cooking are permitted but no larger than a 5' x5'x5' area and cannot burn longer than three hours. Large bonfires will require a special permit. If you have questions or you are just unsure about whether you are allowed to burn, please call us to avoid any problems. Special burning permits may be issued by the fire department after an inspection of the material you are wishing to burn, please contact us at 724-342-0669, M-F, 8:30 am to 5:00 pm.

County/City Tax Bills

All County/City tax bills were sent on March 1st, 2016. Remember that it is your responsibility to inform the tax office if you did not receive your bill.

Also, keep in mind that those of you with taxes paid through escrow accounts, must forward your bills to your Mortgage Company. As a homeowner area, we are required to send tax bills directly to the homeowners and not the lenders.

The lenders must have your

bill before they can forward payment to our office. The discount amounts on County/City taxes are honored in our office until Monday, May 2nd due to April 30th falling on the weekend.

The next tax bills go out on August 1st. At that time you should receive both the School Tax bill and your Per Capita bill. If your annual income falls under \$10,000.00 from all sources, with proof, there is an exoneration from part of the Per Capita. - Automatic payments of current month charges can be deducted from your checking account. Sign-up forms are available at the Municipal Building. Payments are deducted on the 5th of the month or the next business day after the 5th in the case of a weekend or holiday. **Past due balances will not be auto deducted and will continue to accrue penalty and interest.**
- Checks may be mailed to the lock box in the envelope provided with your bill. You **MUST** include the remit stub from your bill in order for your payment to be processed correctly. Payments without remit stubs may be delayed and late fees will accrue.
- Online bill pay through your bank. Please remember account or customer number has to be included with each payment entered. If not, payment may be delayed and late fees will accrue. **It can take up to seven days for payment to process so please allow for this additional time.**
